

## **King County Forestry Program 2003 Monitoring Data**

The King County Forestry Program focuses on the retention of forestland for its environmental, social, and economic benefits. The Forestry Program provides education, technical assistance, and economic incentives aimed at retaining the forest resources of King County. The Program strives to both prevent the parcelization of large industrial forests and encourage forest stewardship by residential forest landowners.

Federal Ownership = 352,400 acres  
State Ownership = 92,200 acres
