COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT PROCESS

Metro and the City of Seattle staff members began conducting informal briefings on the Denny Way/Lake Union CSO Control Project in Fall 1991. Elected officials as well as representatives from regulatory agencies, environmental organizations, community groups, and area businesses have been contacted and kept updated on the project's status.

In June 1994, an informal flyer describing the project, announcing a public meeting and soliciting comments was distributed to approximately 17,000 residents and businesses in the proposed project area. Notice of the public meeting was published in the Seattle Times, Seattle Post Intelligencer, Seattle Press, Queen Anne News, and Magnolia News. The meeting was held on June 28, 1994, at the Port of Seattle. Twelve citizens attended the meeting.
