



Work on the Henderson /

ML King CSO Project is under way in your neighborhood. This King County project will help protect public health and the environment by eliminating overflows to Lake Washington and improving the sewer system throughout the Rainier Beach community.

Spring sewer work on MLK Way South, South Henderson and South Fairbanks streets

Over the next several months, construction in your area near South Henderson, Carkeek Drive South, South Fairbanks and Martin Luther King Jr. Way South will consist of the following activities:

March – April 2003

- Construction of a new water line, sewer line and storm drains on South Fairbanks Street
- Relocation of gas lines on South Fairbanks and MLK Way South
- Relocation of fiber-optic duct bank on MLK Way South
- Completion of construction fencing and platforms in areas of work.

April – June 2003

- Excavation of inlet regulator shaft at South Fairbanks and 42nd Avenue South
- Excavation of manhole northeast of 42nd Avenue South and Henderson Street
- Excavation of manhole at MLK Way South and South Fairbanks

Traffic Revisions

Much of this work will be done on or near MLK Way South and South Fairbanks and South Henderson streets. Traffic detours and road revisions will be required to ensure public safety and accommodate construction.

Extra precautions will be taken on Carkeek Drive South, South Henderson and nearby streets. Some roads are slippery, particularly on shaded hills in the early morning during commuter hours. Motorists should use extra caution around

construction and throughout the community as traffic will often be heavier than usual.



Alternate route

South Henderson will remain open, but public use will often be delayed or limited because of lane closures. Signs will direct traffic to an alternative route from 40th Avenue South and Beacon Avenue South to South Cloverdale Street. Motorists can use the traffic signal at Cloverdale to reach on MLK Way South.

Bus stops and routes may change temporarily. For Metro and Seattle Public School buses, more information will be available if this occurs.

What to expect during construction

Besides rerouting traffic away from ongoing work, construction at times could include noise, dust and vibration. King County and the contractor are taking steps to minimize any disturbances to community members.
