KAMBER ROAD CLOSURE

June 2005



Beginning the first week of June, the King County Wastewater Treatment Division will be repairing a 21-inch sewer line along Kamber Road in Bellevue next to East Creek. Repairs to the county sewer are necessary because of ground settling between Richards Road and 137th Avenue Southeast. The county repairs will protect public health and the environment.

The Project

The City of Bellevue is making utility and roadway improvements on Kamber Road. King County needs to repair its sewer line before the city can begin its work. To keep the city project on schedule, King County will repair the sewer line starting June 15.

All work must be done between June and September.

Between June 1 and July 5, the contractor will work some night shifts and there may be some associated noise.

Project Schedule

The tentative schedule for King County's project is to close Kamber Road on June 1. The county will finish its work by early July so the city can do its work in East Creek during a period specified by state Department of Fish and Wildlife.

King County is doing this project now so it won't need to dig up the road again later.

Detour Route

King County and Wilder Construction will use the same detour route outlined by the city in the May 2005 Update. Please see the attached map.
